Special considerations:

Courses in UCC are taught in modules. A module represents a self-contained fraction of a student's workload for the year. The value of a module is indicated by its credit weighting. The number of credits allocated to each module will vary depending on the fraction of work it accounts for. A module may equal 5, 10, 15, 20 credits. UCC students take modules to the value of 60 credits per academic year.
